## <u>DEFENDANT BUCK GLOBAL, LLC'S MOTION FOR PARTIAL SUMMARY</u> <u>JUDGMENT ON UNCONSTITUTIONALITY OF LA. R.S. § 22:2043.1(A) AS APPLIED</u>

NOW INTO COURT, through undersigned counsel, comes Defendant Buck Global, LLC, to file this Motion for Partial Summary Judgment on Unconstitutionality of La. R.S. § 22:2043.1(A) as Applied, respectfully seeking this Court's ruling that application of La. R.S. § 22:2043.1(A) to deprive Buck of its substantive rights to seek apportionment of fault to the former officers, managers, directors, trustees, owners, employees, or agents of Louisiana Health Cooperative, Inc. ("LAHC"), when Plaintiff has judicially admitted their fault and has deprived Buck and the remaining defendants of any right or remedy against those culpable parties, would violate Buck's constitutional due process rights.

As explained more fully in the memorandum in support filed herewith, due process mandates that Buck be permitted to fully defend itself against the Plaintiff's accusations, which includes the substantive right to apportion fault to parties who are admittedly at fault for the losses Plaintiff now seeks to recover from Buck.
