

## LDH Budget History

Our Medicaid budget is cost stable per capita when adjusted for inflation and has been since 2005.

The budget directly correlates to the number of Louisianians we cover, and the total under coverage is now 1.6 million people.









### Comparing Louisiana's Performance to Others

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


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### **Key Drivers in Louisiana's 2016 Annual Rank**





## Possible Actions to Improve Louisiana's Rank

Reduce the prevalence of low birthweight to the national average (from 10.5% to 8.0%)



Reduce the infant mortality rate to the national average (from 8.1 to 5.8 deaths per 1,000 live births)




Reduce preventable hospitalizations to the national average (from 67.5 to 49.5 per 1,000 beneficiaries)



Louisiana's premature death rates would decline from 9,958 to 9,300 years lost before age 75 per 100,000 population, largely driven by lower infant mortality

- People covered = lives saved



#### Health Care Coverage

#### 410,000 more uninsured

The Senate bill (BCRA) would increase the number of uninsured people under age 65 in Louisiana by 410,000 by 2022.

#### **Hospital Finances**

Under the AHCA (House bill), Louisiana hospitals would face a 36% increase in uncompensated care (treatments and services not paid for by an insurer or patient) and 2.2 percentage point reduction in annual operating margins by 2026. Rural hospitals would face a 30% increase in uncompensated care and 3.0 percentage point reduction in operating margins.


The BCRA would lead to about 22,200 fewer Louisiana jobs by 2026.



## Changing the Culture on Tobacco

- ► Tobacco use is the leading preventable cause of death in the United States.
- ▶ In Louisiana, over 7,000 adults die each year from smoking, and 98,000 kids under 18 will die prematurely from smoking.
- Smoking monetary costs:
  - \$1.89 billion annual healthcare costs in LA
  - \$803 million Medicaid costs in LA

## They focus on 5 priority areas:

- Prevention Initiation of Tobacco Use Among Young People
- 2. Eliminate Exposure to Secondhand Smoke
- 3. Promote Quitting Among Adults and Young People
- 4. Statewide Coordination and Evaluation/Surveillance
- 5. Eliminate Disparities Related to Tobacco-Use

Louisiana has formulated a Tobacco
Control Strategic Plan formulated in
coordination with national, state, and
local organizations.
