Company Overview

- Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Louisiana is the state's oldest and largest health insurer.
- We provide group and individual health insurance plans, life and disability insurance and group voluntary products to more than 1.4 million Louisianians.
- Blue Cross has regional offices in Alexandria, Houma, Lafayette, Lake Charles, Monroe, New Orleans and Shreveport.
- Since 2009, we have worked to inform and educate our members and the public about healthcare reform. Passed in March 2010, this law has had a direct impacted mental health and substance abuse benefits.



Mental Health and the Affordable Care Act

- The ACA requires most individual and small employer health insurance plans, including all plans offered through the Health Insurance Marketplace, to cover mental health and substance use disorder services.
- The ACA also requires most health plans to cover preventive services – like depression screening for adults and behavioral assessments for children – at no additional cost to the member.
- As of 2014, most plans cannot deny you coverage or charge you more due to pre-existing health conditions, including mental illnesses.



Mental Health Parity and Addiction Equity Act

 Passed in 2008, MHPAEA, requires insurance companies to treat mental and behavioral health and substance use disorder coverage equal to (or better than) medical/surgical coverage.

 The MHPAEA law also covers non-financial treatment limits. The law has essentially eliminated such annual limits.



Addressing Demand for Mental Health Services

Provider and Facility Network

- Follow and audit based on URAC, a national quality and accreditation organization.
- Review our network every 2 years to ensure adequacy standards.
- Our members have access to the following:
 - Facilities
 - 1:60 miles for rural areas
 - 1:30 miles for urban areas
 - Providers
 - 1:45 rural areas
 - 1:30 for urban areas



Working Toward Solutions

- Collaboration between behavioral health providers and primary care providers – relationships not formalized.
- Lack of timely follow-up with provider after discharge from an acute mental health facility.
- Difficulty finding out what a provider professional actually treats.
- Need more available adolescent beds for substance abuse treatment.
