Dear Commissioner Temple:

On behalf of the approximately 8,000 members of the Retired State Employees Association (RSEA) of Louisiana and the approximately 230,000 covered lives in the Office of Group Benefits (OGB) health insurance plan, we are opposed to the sale of Blue Cross/Blue Shield (BC/BS) of Louisiana to Elevance Health!

It is our position that as members of OGB, while we do not meet the definition of policy holders for voting purposes, we still have a significant role in this process. Our members utilize the BC/BS network of providers, hospitals and other healthcare facilities in Blue network. BC/BS also acts a third-party administrator (TPA) for our claims processing and other administrative functions, including customer service. Any loss of services or benefits is highly detrimental to us!

To convert BC/BS from a not-for-profit mutual company to a for-profit stock company can only mean higher premiums, lower benefits or a combination of both for our members. We are also concerned about the potential loss of jobs by our fellow citizens in the Baton Rouge area and elsewhere in Louisiana presently employed by BC/BS.

Therefore, before you finalize your decision one way or the other, please remember the hard working employees and retirees who have devoted their lives and careers to the citizens of Louisiana. Let's not deprive them of their hard earned benefits at this point in their lives!
